Why

If the Church is not visible it will die in the villages. For locals it's a sacred place for their ancestors. But we have to face facts that exposure to some form of regular worship in schools is now limited to private education so a lot of people 'don't know what to do' and this is a barrier. Changing the words every 10 years doesn't help as we now have two Lord's Prayers.

The Church fabric will need substantial work and engaging the villagers is critical to that.
